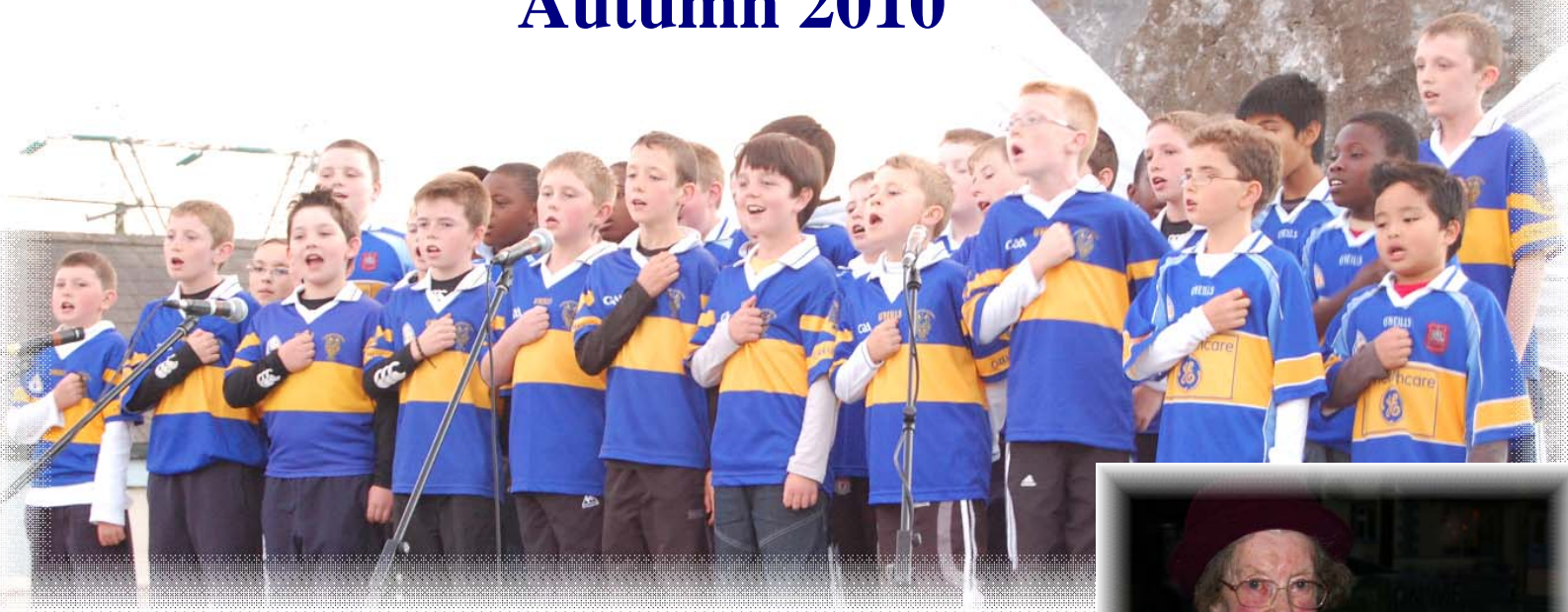

Red Panda Baby at Fota Wildlife Park is named Rua

After 542 suggestions, 264 likes & 4 retweets the baby red panda at Fota Wildlife Park has been named Rua which means red in Gaeilge/Irish.

Rua who was born on the 8th of July has been somewhat of a superstar having appeared on TV, Radio, Print and Online in the last two weeks, even Irish betting company Paddy Power were taking bets on what he would be called.

However up until this morning he didn't have a name, the reason for this was that there was an online competition which had 541 suggestions of which 4 were short-listed for a vote on the Fota Wildlife Park Facebook page.

The name rua meaning red in Irish beat off competition from Cimba, Bob & Bamboo on the social media site with 264 likes. Stephen Ryan head of Marketing with the park was amazed at the response and the amount who liked the name Rua he added "81 people alone suggested the name through our online competition and the lucky winners pulled from the hat were Thomas & Alice Wright from Dalkey in Co Dublin who will get a VIP behind the scenes tour, membership and exclusive goodie bag from the park as a result of winning the competition".

As for Rua, well the good news is that he is thriving in his home at the incubation house at the and is delighted with all the attention that surrounds him at present. He can be seen every day between 10am & 6pm at the incubation house next to the giraffe slide at the park.

Rua who was born on the 8th of July is also looking forward to November the 13th which is the inaugural International Red Panda Day.

The inaugural International Red Panda Day is taking place on Saturday November 13, 2010 and Fota Wildlife Park is holding a special event to help the Red Panda Network make a difference for red panda in the wild.

Tullagreine Walkway

The Community Council has started phase 2 of an amenity walkway to link the footpath at the IDA entrance with the footpath at Fota Business Park.

The pathway will allow walkers and joggers to use this area in safety.

Phase 1 from Fota Business Park to the Roundabout has been completed since early Spring and we hope that Phase 3 will be completed early in 2011 with the assistance of GE Healthcare, our neighbours in the IDA Business park.

This estimated project will cost €24,000 with 50% of this coming from Cork County Council and the remainder coming from the Community Council's own funds which were raised through various fundraising events.

The completion of this project, as well as being a welcome amenity, will also have the effect of improving the entrance at the Tullagreine end of the village.

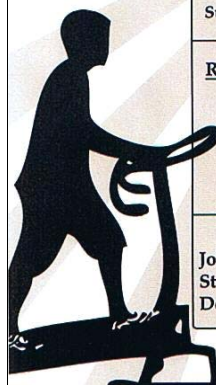

“A Close Shave with the Devil” with well known Actress Ena May (of The Tailor and Ansty” fame) at Fota House on Friday, 15 October.

When Ena May's collection of short stories was published by Lilliput Press in 1998, it was received with excitement by many. On Friday, 15th October and Saturday 16th October she brings a glimpse of her work to the stage at Fota House. In “A Close Shave with the Devil”, which was nominated for an Irish Times Literary Award, she has woven four of her stories together to present a tapestry of life as a young girl in Dublin after the Second World War. Taking it one step beyond mere authorship, she has woven herself into this tapestry by providing the voice for her young heroine Eily, as well as a small city of supporting characters.

Set in the late 1940's, the stories in “A Close Shave with the Devil” are all told by young Eily Doolin who casts a naïve, yet knowing look at the adults in her domestic and larger world. Eily is a gimlet-eyed narrator, who brings a childlike innocence to these ultimately unsettling, yet wickedly humorous tales.

May trained under the late Deirdre O'Connell at the Focus Theatre's own Stanislavski Studio and on display here are all the skills she gained there. With a turn of the head she is transformed from Eily's nemesis, the adenoid-addled, skinned kneed Itchy Rider to the Gaiety's proper Dublin gent of a doorman. When we meet Mr. and Mrs. Smith, she simultaneously plays Mrs. Smith, who is as wide as a Guinness barge and her husband who when standing next to her, “looks like a little grey monkey at the bottom of a purple mountain”.

At the conclusion, we are reminded vividly of what it meant to be children. May's story is so vividly constructed that for a short time we become children again.

Lighting the Rock

September 17th 2010

The Rock at Tullagreine was officially lit up on Friday night 17 September, 2010. This unique feature at the entrance to the village with its engraved flagstones each representing one of the 46 townlands in the parish, the compass, historical information, lighting and logo.

This structure locally called "The Rock" will be a monument for all time.

History

The process of putting this project together has taken a long time. In 2005 an initial approach was made to find a rock of such large dimensions in Healys Quarry.

The 23 tonne stone took two and half years to find and our thanks go to local man, Willie Jagoe for finding such a fine specimen. And so began the process of finding a suitable location and the funding to erect it. It was found that the main entrance to the village at Tullagreine was the most suitable location.

Mick Ramsell, a native Carrigtwohill man, was the ideal stone mason with Sheedys in Midleton our expert stone cutters. Castle Lake's finest graphic designer, Siobhan Duggan of DM Design put together the name plate and logo.

The logo representing the family is at the heart of the community and has been the centre to the survival of Carrigtwohill in the past and will continue to be so in the future.

On Friday 17 September a party was arranged to celebrate the official lighting up of the Rock. The pupils from the boys School Choir performed, dancing from Eadin O'Mahony of the New Moon Youth Dance Company directed by Tina Horan Walsh while Ilse de Zaya played the cello. Children from the girls school also performed.

An esteemed friend of the parish, Johnny Harte (Woodstock) unveiled the Rock while Mrs. Maria Kelleher of Main Street turned on the lights to great applause. Daniel Murphy provided the entertainment with his guitar and songs to keep the party going.

Our local parish priest, Fr. Anthony O'Brien gave the blessing and so finally the Rock was officially lit up.

This project cost is €10,200.00 but the Rock will be there for all time and as such it is an investment in our future and will always be there to welcome us home as well as visitors to Carrigtwohill.

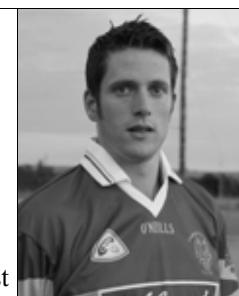
A native of Lismore James is in his first season as Carrig's senior hurling coach.

CARE AND REPAIR PROGRAMME

Providing a service for our senior citizens

If you are over 65 and have a minor repair job which you would like to have done for you, Cork Care and Repair uses a pool of trustworthy volunteers and handypersons to carry out minor repairs for older people. This programme is run in association with age action Ireland – the national organisation which works to improve the quality of life of all older people and their carers. It has been operating in some Cork areas for a while now.

The programme consists of three services:

- (1) The Repair Service.
- (2) The Trades Referral Service (a register of honest and reliable tradespersons)
- (3) The Quote Check Service.

Volunteers in effect provide a willing pair of helping hands to do a variety of small tasks that an older person may find difficult to do.

A group of volunteers have now got together in the Carrigtwohill area to provide a local Care and Repair service. The service is free of charge; the client only pays for the cost of materials used, (though voluntary donations are welcome).
